- 2. **Know your audience.** Our church is made up of people from many backgrounds when it comes to the Book of Revelation. Some are excited for our series. Some have neglected the book. Others have been subjected to strange, extreme, or fanatical teaching in their past. Some spiritual explorers have never opened the book. Many are more familiar with popular fiction books and movies than the actual Book of Revelation itself. And there are believers from a wide variety of interpretive backgrounds. So, be humble. Be sensitive. Don't push one, narrow view or disrespect others. And realize that our church is represented by a wide array of

- Keep your finger on the text. Make sure that we the 21st century. So, our focus will not be on "what's new Asia." - 4. **Avoid speculation.** It's not the Book of Speculation. It's the Book of Revelation. We are bound to what God has actually written in the Bible. So, we avoid voicing merely personal opinions or commentary on contemporary happenings. The Book of Revelation is intensely practical and hope-filled. So, it certainly has application to our daily lives in 2022. But we want to avoid needless, speculative conversations on secondary matters. Keep the main thing the main thing.
- and humble heart. We don't have all the answers. As one mentor of mind said: "When we all get to heaven, we will discover that we have been wrong about many things." That's wise counsel.
