Revelation: Fearless & Faithful

January 2023 - August 2023 **Proverbs: Boundless Wisdom**

Valley Church is committed to the faithful, clear, and practical teaching of the Word of God every weekend. In the past year, in addition to our holiday Boundless Christmas series, we focused on chapter-by-chapter, Christcentered teaching of the Book of Revelation and the Book of Proverbs. We concluded a 34-week series in Revelation, and a 31-week series in Proverbs.

In Revelation, we learned how to be "fearless and faithful" as we follow Jesus in uncertain and challenging times. We took a deep-dive into the historic, current, and future implications of the Book of Revelation. This study was supplemented by periodic "Digging Deeper" seminars. In Proverbs, we focused on developing a grace-based fear of the Lord-learning to respect God so much that we consistently say yes to him. We are just starting an exciting new series, "Christ Above All" from Paul's letter to the Colossians.









LIFE GROUPS

Cultivating friendship by living out God's word together.

Exciting Growth

Life Groups are adults who gather regularly to build Christ-centered friendships around God's Word. At the close of this summer, we are thrilled to welcome over 300 new people into Life Groups... an all-time record for Valley Church in a single season of sign ups!

Believer Baptisms

Over the past year, Valley Church celebrated 36 individuals who publicly professed their faith in Jesus through baptism gatherings in February, July, and November! The church body was energized by their testimonies.

Assisted Listening and Spanish Interpretation Launched

Over the past year, Valley Church began discerning how to better serve our church family using an assisted listening software. We began providing support to our Spanish speaking attenders and hearing impaired during our Christmas gatherings. Now, each week we provide live Spanish interpretation during our 11 am auditorium gathering as well as hearing impairment support during our auditorium gatherings.

Christmas Dinner for Internationals

The Christmas Dinner for Internationals continues to be a strong opportunity for Valley Church to provide a cross-cultural experience for those of Valley and the surrounding community. This past year, many relationships were built and strengthened with internationals from all over the world.









MINISTRY HIGHLIGHTS

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

The Children's Ministry team continued its efforts to instill the love of Jesus in kids while also focusing on building up families and reaching out to others.

Weekly Programming: We added full programming for the 8:15 worship gathering in November and were blessed with growth in Children's Ministry at every worship gathering and age group this year. Rooms were also filled on Wednesday nights with 385 students registered for Valley Kids Club. These weekly ministry programs couldn't happen without the 250+ volunteers who serve faithfully.

Family Experience: We hosted 3 family nights through the school year to encourage families to "Build Up" their relationships at home and learn new ways to "Reach Out" to others to share the love of Jesus. Along with Middle School Ministry, we co-hosted a parent seminar with an expert on children's mental health as we seek to foster healthy relationships. 149 families joined us for these events.

Family Outreach: Families took over 120 kits to reach out to others in their neighborhoods through Kindness Kits, Easter Egg Hunt Kits, and May Day Kits. Families were also able to make and take Advent kits for Christmas as well as Easter devotions to help focus on Jesus as a family during those holidays.

Easter with Kids: Over 375 4-year-old through fifth-grade students celebrated the resurrection of Jesus and stepped into the Bible time worlds of John, a Royal Servant, and Miriam, and left with activities and discussion prompts to continue to have conversations at home. Our nursery also celebrated Easter with over 135 0-3-year-olds.

Love You Des Moines Days: Children's Ministry and High School Ministries hosted "Splash Bash" at the start of Love You Des Moines Days with over 1,500 individuals from all demographics of our community coming to partake in this fun water-themed event to build momentum for the rest of the week.

Community Bridges: Our relationship with families at Chapel Ridge West continues to grow and thrive through inviting and driving them to and from Valley Kids Club on Wednesdays. This year we also supported the volunteer run Sidewalk Kids as they took the gospel message to the parking lot for six-week sessions in the fall and spring. It's a joy to see some families from Chapel Ridge West come on Sundays to worship and volunteer at Valley Church.

Baptism and Child Dedication: 13 children took their next faith step through baptism at two special services this past year, and 43 parents dedicated themselves to raise 29 children to know and love Jesus.

Great Pumpkin Party: This three-night community event, plus one night for adults and families with special needs, brought over 8,000 people to the church and VCC. We appreciate the 1,200+ volunteers who donated candy and/or served one or more nights to welcome our community.

MIDDLE SCHOOL MINISTRY

This was an exciting year in the Middle School Ministry! We expanded our leadership pipeline and built into future leaders by launching a young adult internship program. Two students completed that year-long program and are now launching into further ministry opportunities at college.

At our Fall Retreat in September, students had the opportunity to publicly share their faith stories. In November, we welcomed 750 students and volunteers, including many first-time visitors, for the epic Blitz All-Nighter! On Sunday mornings in January and February, about 60 of our students went through a 6-week training on the 3D1 evangelism strategy. Then in April, 30 8th-12th graders led activities during the first-ever Love You Des Moines Family Day.

Throughout the school year, we had a unique, fun theme every Wednesday night. One of the most popular was Cake Night, where we served more than 200 pieces of Costco cake and saw 10 first-time students attend.

The summer was full of weekly special events, the most popular being Night At The VCC, with over 80 students and volunteers in attendance!

HIGH SCHOOL MINISTRY

What an amazing year in High School Ministry (HSM)! We are so encouraged and excited about all that God did this past year. Here are just a few of note:

- We began the year with Fall Kickoff, an event that saw over 200 students and parents in attendance!
- We continued this momentum in October when we took over 100 students to Fall Retreat at Hidden Acres.
- Our Sunday Night Gatherings saw a 20% increase in attendance this year!
- One of the factors that contributed to this growth is the mission mindset of our students who brought with them over 20 visitors this year—many of whom are now regular attenders!
- God worked in the hearts of many of our students who had the courage to begin Bible studies at their schools. One group saw over 80 students at an event they hosted at their school!

We feel honored to have been a part of all that God has done this year and look forward to another year of spiritual, relational, and numerical growth!







HAND in Hand



SUNDAY MORNING:

- We have 22 one-on-one buddies.
- There are 48 families who are a part of our Hand in Hand ministry.
- We regularly welcome new families seeking out a church that can support their special needs child.

ADULTS:

- Our Christ-centered adult Sunday class continues to grow.
- Four times a year, Friday night CONNECT events host 50-60 adults with special needs.
- Harvest Hoedown was a big hit this year with over 200 in attendance.

NIGHT TO SHINE:

- Nearly 300 in-person guests at Valley Church and the Valley Community Center were crowned as kings and queens.
- Over 700 volunteers helped to make this a special prom experience and show Jesus' love to guests, parents, and caregivers.



FAMILY SUPPORT:

Both the moms' and dads' support groups meet regularly for Bible study, conversation, and fun as we strive to support families experiencing the challenge of raising a child with special needs.



LOVE YOU DES MOINES DAYS:

We had 25 moms painting and 20 adults with special needs crafting, including new individuals from our community.

BIBLE STUDY

This year, 357 women attended numerous studies, including John, Lamb of God, Find Your People, Joshua—a video teaching format written and presented by Valley Women, Isaiah, and In His Image.

MOPS/LIFTT

Mothers of Preschoolers and Ladies in Faith and Truth Together exist to provide moms a place for connection. The bi-monthly gatherings include speakers, small group discussions, prayer, and more. This year, 86 moms and 93 children participated.

MENTORING

This year, 35 Mentoring pairs of women grew in their faith, relationships, and life responsibilities. One of our mentees wrote, "I've felt much more connected spiritually to God. Being able to talk to someone on such a deep level, and having those spiritual concerns outside of family has been wonderful. My mentor has challenged me and has been a wonderful friend."

CONNECTING

Highlights include the Christmas Bash where 500 women attended and the Holiday Maker's Market where 2,500 people from our community did their Christmas shopping from 90+ local vendors.

COMPASSION MINISTRY

The Care & Compassion Team contacts women going through illnesses or difficult life experiences. Included in the Compassion Ministry are: Mending the Soul, Rhythms of Renewal, Cancer Support Group, Valley Quilters, and Valley Hooks & Needles.

PRAYER

Each week, prayer requests and needs are sent out to 65+ women. A Moms in Prayer group was added this year.

MEN'S MINISTRY

Life Groups

Several men's specific life groups are meeting, and new groups can be formed as there is interest. Life groups are launched several times throughout the year, so if you are interested, join these sign-up opportunities.

CrossTrainers (CT)

This is where the men of Valley go every Wednesday morning to be equipped and encouraged to be great in their God-given roles. A legacy of fellowship and faithfulness since 1989. All generations of men find a valuable place to build one another up to live well and finish strong.

Coming this fall: Point Man is an 11-week series on how a man can lead his family. Held at the Valley Community Center on Wednesdays from 6:30-7:30 am (online option available).

Mentoring

If you are interested in a men's mentoring program, go to valley.church/men to sign up. Some of the service projects offered this year include hundreds of Valley Disaster Relief tree removal projects, along with service trips to Alaska, Brussels, and New Orleans.

Business As Missions

Business As Missions gives opportunities for men with a business background to work with local churches in Kenya, and other regions, to train potential entrepreneurs on how to develop, run, and maintain a successful business.





BOUNDLESS GENEROSITY

During our Good News for Christmas season, our Valley Church family demonstrated their boundless generosity once again by funding these impactful projects over and above normal giving. Thank you once again for showing your love in these amazing ways, both in our own community and around the world.

CHILDREN OF AFGHAN REFUGEES IN DES MOINES

Our 15-passenger van provides access to resources for those in need. Some of the ministry uses are shuttle services for refugees, rides to weekly programming, and transportation to retreats.

RENOVATIONS IN BRUSSELS, BELGIUM

Valley's global partners at LePhare church acquired a building that required extensive repairs. Your gifts, sent along with a construction team this summer, removed and replaced the roof.

SPORTS AND EDUCATION COMPLEX IN MADAGASCAR

Through your support and collaboration with Trailhead International Builders and partners in Madagascar, a new sports outreach and education building has been constructed.

HAND IN HAND

Valley Church has been blessed to offer one of the premier special needs ministries in the country! Year end generosity allows us to prepare and serve special children and adults, as well as their families. Night to Shine will return in February. We are excited to celebrate this amazing night in style.

LOVE YOU DES MOINES

We love our neighbors, and we love Des Moines! Not only giving generously in finances, over 4800 volunteer hours went into the Love You Des Moines Days to reach over 12,500 neighbors.

VALLEY CARES

We are strengthening our partnerships with existing organizations serving women and children in crisis, such as Agape Pregnancy Center, Hope Ministries, and Start Small Project. New initiatives to support Valley Church foster and adoptive families are being launched soon!

STATEMENT OF FAITH

GOD

We believe in one God, Creator of all things, holy, infinitely perfect, and eternally existing in a loving unity of three equally divine Persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Having limitless knowledge and sovereign power, God has graciously purposed from eternity to redeem a people for Himself and to make all things new for His own glory.

THE BIBLE

We believe that God has spoken in the scriptures, both Old and New Testaments, through the words of human authors. As the verbally inspired Word of God, the Bible is without error in the original writings, the complete revelation of His will for salvation, and the ultimate authority by which every realm of human knowledge and endeavor should be judged. Therefore, it is to be believed in all that it teaches, obeyed in all that it requires, and trusted in all that it promises.

THE HUMAN CONDITION

We believe that God created Adam and Eve in His image, but they sinned when tempted by Satan. In union with Adam, human beings are sinners by nature and by choice, alienated from God, and under His wrath. Only through God's saving work in Jesus Christ can we be rescued, reconciled, and renewed.

JESUS CHRIST

We believe that Jesus Christ is God incarnate, fully God and fully man, one Person in two natures. Jesus, Israel's promised Messiah, was conceived through the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. He lived a sinless life, was crucified under Pontius Pilate, arose bodily from the dead, ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father as our High Priest and Advocate.

THE HOLY SPIRIT

We believe that the Holy Spirit, in all that He does, glorifies the Lord Jesus Christ. He convicts the world of its guilt. He regenerates sinners, and in Him they are baptized into union with Christ and adopted as heirs in the family of God. He also indwells, illuminates, guides, equips, and empowers believers for Christ-like living and service.

STATEMENT OF FAITH

THE WORK OF CHRIST

We believe that Jesus Christ, as our representative and substitute, shed His blood on the cross as the perfect, all-sufficient sacrifice for our sins. His atoning death and victorious resurrection constitute the only ground for salvation.

THE CHURCH

We believe that the true church comprises all who have been justified by God's grace through faith alone in Christ alone. They are united by the Holy Spirit in the body of Christ, of which He is the Head. The true church is manifest in local churches, whose membership should be composed only of believers. The Lord Jesus mandated two ordinances, baptism and the Lord's Supper, which visibly and tangibly express the gospel. Though they are not the means of salvation, when celebrated by the church in genuine faith, these ordinances confirm and nourish the believer.

CHRISTIAN LIVING

We believe that God's justifying grace must not be separated from His sanctifying power and purpose. God commands us to love Him supremely and others sacrificially, and to live out our faith with care for one another, compassion toward the poor, and justice for the oppressed. With God's Word, the Spirit's power, and fervent prayer in Christ's name, we are to combat the spiritual forces of evil. In obedience to Christ's commission, we are to make disciples among all people, always bearing witness to the gospel in word and deed.

CHRIST'S RETURN

We believe in the personal, bodily, and glorious return of our Lord Jesus Christ. The coming of Christ, at a time known only to God, demands constant expectancy and, as our blessed hope, motivates the believer to godly living, sacrificial service, and energetic mission.

RESPONSE AND ETERNAL DESTINY

We believe that God commands everyone everywhere to believe the gospel by turning to Him in repentance and receiving the Lord Jesus Christ. We believe that God will raise the dead bodily and judge the world, assigning the unbeliever to condemnation and eternal conscious punishment and the believer to eternal blessedness and joy with the Lord in the new heaven and the new earth, to the praise of His glorious grace. 

SUMMARY OF FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP AS OF AUGUST 31, 2023

We celebrate and thank God for all the people of Valley Church and their unwavering support and generosity this past year. Let's take a moment to celebrate the accomplishments we have achieved as a community.

Giving to Valley Church Ministries Fund this last ministry year totaled \$6,132,046. In addition, believers at Valley were led by God to generously provide gifts of \$70,664 to Boundless Christmas. This resulted in direct blessings to many local and international missions through:

- New Ministry Van
- Renovations in Brussels, Belgium
- Sports & Education

 Complex in Madagascar
- Valley Cares

- Love You Des Moines Outreach
- Hand in Hand Ministry

We also celebrate the extremely generous support by Valley Church individuals toward sponsorship of nearly 800 children in our close partnership, with Compassion International. These funds are not reflected in gifts to the Ministries Fund, but they do represent approximately \$413,000 in the last twelve months. It's another example of the sacrificial generosity of the Valley Church family.

Total expenses were \$6,307,620 (made up of Ministries Fund \$6,129,800 expenses and capital asset purchases of \$177,520). When comparing Ministries Fund income of \$6,132,046 to our Ministries Fund expenses, we had income that exceeded expenses by \$2,246. The modest capital asset purchases came from our healthy reserves. We are so grateful for God's provision through your generosity!

Valley Church's commitment to taking the Good News worldwide was supported by \$423,526 (\$288,478 from the ministry support plan and \$135,048 from designated giving to missions).

The 2023-24 ministry support plan proposes a 4.5% increase over last year's plan. We take the responsibility of stewarding your gifts very seriously and strive to ensure that every contribution is used wisely. This budget reflects our commitment to loving our community while mobilizing everyone's God given potential to deeply love Christ and their neighbors.

Thank you once again for your unwavering support. Together, let's make an even greater impact as we seek God's direction to share the Good News in our community and around the world!




