Don'ts

01

Don't stand in the back during large group time. Sit with students.

02

Don't cluster with other volunteers during program. Focus on students.

03

Don't use your phone excessively during program. It communicates you're not interested.

04

Don't be a friend. Students need you to be a leader.

05

Don't let your discomfort or insecurity get in the way of interacting with students.

You Know You've Succeeded When

01

You are able to greet students by name, with a smile, and students are excited to see you.

02

You connect with at least one student in a meaningful way during the night, whether through conversation, prayer, activities, or silliness.



You show or tell at least one student one way they can deeply love Christ and their neighbors.
