Valley Church is committed to the faithful, clear, and practical teaching of the Word of God every weekend. We focus always on verse-by-verse, Christ-centered teaching.

In Colossians, we learned how to be a good news person in a bad news culture by experiencing the power of Christ in us, the hope of glory. Christ Above All was our theme.

In our Spiritual Geographic series, we took a visual and theological tour of 11 epic spaces and places where God meets us.

We then centered on crucial turning points in the life of Jesus in our Make Room series. Through seven important events recorded in the gospels, we were encouraged to make room for God to move, to be family, and to grow the family.

Next, we embarked on a 14-week exploration of the fascinating and powerful Book of Daniel. Through his courageous example and breakthrough visions and prophecies, we experienced Thriving in a Strange New World.

Finally, we took a deep dive into Paul's letter to the Romans and his emphasis on Everybody, One Body. We were stretched to consider how each of us can have a profound impact by surrendering our whole lives to God, and by using our spiritual gifts.

LIFE GROUPS

Cultivating friendship by living out God's Word together.

Exciting Growth

Life Groups are adults who gather regularly to build Christ-centered friendships around God's Word. At the close of this summer, we are thrilled to welcome over 346 new people into Life Groups with 204 being for the first time at Valley.

Believer Baptisms

Over the past year, Valley Church celebrated 35 individuals who publicly professed their faith in Jesus through baptism gatherings in February, July, and November! The church body was energized by their testimonies.

Assisted Listening and Spanish Interpretation Launched

Over the past year, Valley Church began discerning how to better serve our church family using an assisted listening software. We began providing support to our Spanish speaking attenders and hearing impaired during our Christmas gatherings. Now, each week we provide live Spanish interpretation during our 11 am auditorium gathering as well as hearing impairment support during our auditorium gatherings.

Christmas Dinner for Internationals

The Christmas Dinner for Internationals continues to be a strong opportunity for Valley Church to provide a cross-cultural experience for those of Valley and the surrounding community. This past year, many relationships were built and strengthened with internationals from all over the world.









MINISTRY HIGHLIGHTS

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

The Children's Ministry team continued its efforts to instill the love of Jesus in kids while also focusing on building up families and reaching out to others.

Weekly Programming: 325+ children took part in nursery and Sunday School each week as we shared the gospel and love of Jesus through games, crafts, activities, prayer, and Bible teaching. Rooms were also filled on Wednesday nights with 367 students registered for Valley Kids Club. These weekly ministry programs couldn't happen without the 230+ volunteers who serve faithfully.

Family Experience: We hosted 2 family nights during the school year to encourage family fun, create a space for spiritual conversation, and think of ways to reach out to others. Over 100 families joined us for these events.

Family Outreach: 80+ families took Easter Egg Hunt Kits and May Day Kits to reach out to their neighbors. Families were also able to make and take Advent kits for Christmas as well as Kindness Kits in February.

Easter with Kids: Over 300 4-year-old through 5th-grade students celebrated the resurrection of Jesus and focused on how we can "Get off the mountain" and share the good news like the disciples did after the Great Commission. Our nursery also celebrated Easter with over 140 0-3-year-olds.

Love You Des Moines Days: Children's Ministry and High School Ministries once again hosted "Splash Bash" at the start of Love You Des Moines Days with over 1,000 individuals from all demographics of our community coming to partake in this fun water-themed event to build momentum for the rest of the week.

Community Bridges: Our relationship with families at Chapel Ridge West continues to grow and thrive through inviting and driving them to and from Valley Kids Club on Wednesdays. This year we also supported the volunteer run Sidewalk Kids as they took the gospel message to the parking lot for six-week sessions in the fall and spring. It's a joy to see some families from Chapel Ridge West come on Sundays to worship and volunteer at Valley Church.

Baptism and Child Dedication: 21 children took their next faith step through baptism at three special services this last year and 51 parents dedicated themselves to raise 31 children to know and love Jesus at our Child Dedication Celebrations.

Great Pumpkin Party: This 3-night community event plus one night for adults and families with special needs brought over 10,000 people to the church and VCC. We appreciate the 1,000+ volunteers who donated candy and/or served one or more nights to welcome our community.

MIDDLE SCHOOL MINISTRY

What a great year in the Middle School Ministry! Our year started with a Fall Retreat at Hidden Acres in September. Numerous middle school students served joyfully at the Great Pumpkin Party in October. Then in November we hosted 700 total middle school students and adult volunteers from 15 area churches for the epic Blitz All-Nighter! We partnered with other EFCA Central District churches for the Winter Blast Retreat at Hidden Acres in January. We also had a fun Staff Scavenger Hunt event in March where our volunteers dressed up in disguise and hid at the Jordan Creek Mall. In April our ministry partnered with the Valley Community Center for a wildly successful Community Bridge called Love You Des Moines Family Day. We had two high school students participate in our year-long internship program to develop future church leaders. 10+ middle schoolers were baptized throughout the year. Throughout the year students learned about who Jesus is, the significance of God becoming human, and how Jesus shows up in the Old Testament. Praise God for spiritual growth in students' lives and new and deeper friendships between students!

HIGH SCHOOL MINISTRY

What a remarkable year in High School Ministry! We are beyond grateful and filled with excitement as we reflect on all that God accomplished through our students and leaders this past year. With a heart to try something new, we launched Kickoff Events—unique gatherings designed to ignite excitement around each new teaching series and inspire students to invite their friends. And it worked! These events saw a 25% boost in attendance, and thanks to the incredible spirit of invitation among our students, we welcomed 34 new visitors into our community. We are in awe of how God continues to grow and shape this ministry. To Him be all the glory!

Here are a few other areas of celebration:

- Over 200 students and parents attended Fall Kick-Off.
- Over 100 students attended Fall Retreat.
- 3 new Bible studies were started by some of our students.
- 30 students attended Challenge Conference.
- 30 students served at Hidden Acres over the Summer.

We are truly honored to have been part of the incredible work God has done this year! As we look ahead, we are filled with anticipation and excitement for another year of growth—spiritually, relationally, and as a community. We can't wait to see how God continues to move as we Make Room this year!







HAND in Hand



SUNDAY MORNING:

- We have 21 one-on-one buddies.
- There are 50 families who are a part of our Hand in Hand ministry.
- We regularly welcome new families seeking out a church that can support their special needs child.

ADULTS:

- Our Christ-centered adult Sunday class continues to grow.
- Four times a year, Friday night CONNECT events host 100+ adults with special needs.
- Harvest Hoedown was a big hit this year with over 350 in attendance.

NIGHT TO SHINE:

- Nearly 300 in-person guests at Valley Church and the Valley Community Center were crowned as kings and queens. Spots filled up in less than 14 hours.
- Over 700 volunteers helped to make this a special prom experience and show Jesus' love to guests, parents, and caregivers.



FAMILY SUPPORT:

Both the moms' and dads' support groups meet regularly for Bible study, conversation, and fun as we strive to support families experiencing the challenge of raising a child with special needs.



LOVE YOU DES MOINES DAYS:

We had 15 moms painting and 60 adults with special needs attended a kickboxing class that is now a weekly class with a large attendance.

BIBLE STUDY

This year, 238 women attended numerous studies, including John, Lamb of God, Find Your People, Joshua—a video teaching format written and presented by Valley Women, Isaiah, and In His Image.

MOMCO (FORMERLY MOPS)

Mothers of Preschoolers and Ladies in Faith and Truth Together exist to provide moms a place for connection. The bi-monthly gatherings include speakers, small group discussions, prayer, and more. This year, 100 moms and 120 children participated.

MENTORING

This year, 39 Mentoring pairs of women grew in their faith, relationships, and life responsibilities. One of our mentees wrote, "I've felt much more connected spiritually to God. Being able to talk to someone on such a deep level, and having those spiritual concerns outside of family has been wonderful. My mentor has challenged me and has been a wonderful friend."

CONNECTING

Highlights include the Christmas Bash where 500 women attended and the Holiday Maker's Market where 4,000 people from our community did their Christmas shopping from 90+ local vendors.

COMPASSION MINISTRY

The Care & Compassion Team contacts women going through illnesses or difficult life experiences. Included in the Compassion Ministry are: Mending the Soul, Rhythms of Renewal, Cancer Support Group, Valley Quilters, and Valley Hooks & Needles.

PRAYER

Each week, prayer requests and needs are sent out to 65+ women. A Moms in Prayer group was added this year.

MEN'S MINISTRY

LIFE GROUPS

Several men's specific Life Groups are meeting, and new groups can be formed as there is interest. Life Groups are launched several times throughout the year, so if you are interested, join these sign-up opportunities.

CROSSTRAINERS (CT)

This is where the men of Valley go every Wednesday morning to be equipped and encouraged to be great in their God-given roles. A legacy of fellowship and faithfulness since 1989. All generations of men find a valuable place to build one another up to live well and finish strong.

REGROUP TUESDAYS AT 10 AM AT VALLEY CHURCH:

ReGroup is about fun, fellowship, and finishing well. It's for older men, mostly retired, who encourage each other and explore what God's purpose is for them in this phase of their life.

MENTORING

If you are interested in a men's mentoring program, go to valley.church/men to sign up. Some of the service projects offered this year include hundreds of Valley Disaster Relief tree removal projects, along with service trips to Alaska, Brussels, and New Orleans.

BUSINESS AS MISSIONS

Several men from Valley Church have specifically chosen to connect with Business as Missions to work with local churches in Africa and Asia, and to train potential entrepreneurs on how to develop, lead, and maintain a successful business.





BOUNDLESS GENEROSITY

During Christmas season, our Valley Church family demonstrated their boundless generosity once again by funding these impactful projects over and above normal giving. Thank you once again for showing your love in these amazing ways, both in our own community and around the world.

GLOBAL GREENS FARM

On this 6.5-acre farm located at the Valley Community Center, we partner with LSI to reconnect former refugee farmers' with the land as they build their new life in the U.S. Produce from the farm is sold in farmer's markets around Des Moines and at Valley Church.

HAND IN HAND

Valley Church has been blessed to offer one of the premier special needs ministries, Night to Shine. This prom event for adults with special needs welcomes over 250 guests each year at the Valley Community Center!

LOVE YOU DES MOINES

We love our neighbors, and we love Des Moines!

During Love You Des Moines Days, we welcome

STATEMENT OF FAITH

GOD

We believe in one God, Creator of all things, holy, infinitely perfect, and eternally existing in a loving unity of three equally divine Persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Having limitless knowledge and sovereign power, God has graciously purposed from eternity to redeem a people for Himself and to make all things new for His own glory.

THE BIBLE

We believe that God has spoken in the scriptures, both Old and New Testaments, through the words of human authors. As the verbally inspired Word of God, the Bible is without error in the original writings, the complete revelation of His will for salvation, and the ultimate authority by which every realm of human knowledge and endeavor should be judged. Therefore, it is to be believed in all that it teaches, obeyed in all that it requires, and trusted in all that it promises.

THE HUMAN CONDITION

We believe that God created Adam and Eve in His image, but they sinned when tempted by Satan. In union with Adam, human beings are sinners by nature and by choice, alienated from God, and under His wrath. Only through God's saving work in Jesus Christ can we be rescued, reconciled, and renewed.

JESUS CHRIST

We believe that Jesus Christ is God incarnate, fully God and fully man, one Person in two natures. Jesus, Israel's promised Messiah, was conceived through the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. He lived a sinless life, was crucified under Pontius Pilate, arose bodily from the dead, ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father as our High Priest and Advocate.

THE HOLY SPIRIT

We believe that the Holy Spirit, in all that He does, glorifies the Lord Jesus Christ. He convicts the world of its guilt. He regenerates sinners, and in Him they are baptized into union with Christ and adopted as heirs in the family of God. He also indwells, illuminates, guides, equips, and empowers believers for Christ-like living and service.

STATEMENT OF FAITH

THE WORK OF CHRIST

We believe that Jesus Christ, as our representative and substitute, shed His blood on the cross as the perfect, all-sufficient sacrifice for our sins. His atoning death and victorious resurrection constitute the only ground for salvation.

THE CHURCH

We believe that the true church comprises all who have been justified by God's grace through faith alone in Christ alone. They are united by the Holy Spirit in the body of Christ, of which He is the Head. The true church is manifest in local churches, whose membership should be composed only of believers. The Lord Jesus mandated two ordinances, baptism and the Lord's Supper, which visibly and tangibly express the gospel. Though they are not the means of salvation, when celebrated by the church in genuine faith, these ordinances confirm and nourish the believer.

CHRISTIAN LIVING

We believe that God's justifying grace must not be separated from His sanctifying power and purpose. God commands us to love Him supremely and others sacrificially, and to live out our faith with care for one another, compassion toward the poor, and justice for the oppressed. With God's Word, the Spirit's power, and fervent prayer in Christ's name, we are to combat the spiritual forces of evil. In obedience to Christ's commission, we are to make disciples among all people, always bearing witness to the gospel in word and deed.

CHRIST'S RETURN

We believe in the personal, bodily, and glorious return of our Lord Jesus Christ. The coming of Christ, at a time known only to God, demands constant expectancy and, as our blessed hope, motivates the believer to godly living, sacrificial service, and energetic mission.

RESPONSE AND ETERNAL DESTINY

We believe that God commands everyone everywhere to believe the gospel by turning to Him in repentance and receiving the Lord Jesus Christ. We believe that God will raise the dead bodily and judge the world, assigning the unbeliever to condemnation and eternal conscious punishment and the believer to eternal blessedness and joy with the Lord in the new heaven and the new earth, to the praise of His glorious grace. 

SUMMARY OF FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP AS OF AUGUST 31, 2024

We give thanks to God for the unwavering support and generosity of everyone in our church community this past year. Let's take a moment to celebrate the incredible milestones we've reached together.

This past ministry year, contributions to our Church Ministry Fund totaled \$6,448,520. We are also overjoyed by the remarkable support from our members, who sponsor nearly 924 children through Compassion International. While these contributions are not included in the Ministry Fund, they amount to approximately \$500,000 over the past year, demonstrating the sacrificial generosity of our church family.

Total cash expenditures for the year amounted to \$6,613,624, which includes \$6,190,440 in budgeted Ministry Fund expenses, \$88,604 in capital asset purchases, and \$334,581 in principal payments on loans. With Ministry Fund income at \$6,448,520, we had a surplus of \$258,080. The modest capital asset purchases were funded from our reserves, and we are deeply grateful for God's provision through your generosity.

Our commitment to sharing the Good News worldwide was further supported by \$644,287 with \$509,239 allocated from our ministry support plan and \$135,048 from designated giving to missions.

Looking ahead, the 2024-25 ministry support plan includes a proposed 4.7% increase over last year's budget. We are committed to being faithful stewards of your contributions, ensuring that every dollar is used wisely to reflect our mission: loving our community and mobilizing everyone to fully live out their calling to love Christ and their neighbors.

The Facilities Planning Team will use the commitments to carefully sequence, steward, plan, and lead in the renovation and new construction in the months ahead. The Make Room ministry expansion is entirely funded through your generous commitments and gifts to Make Room, through our ongoing Ministries Fund, and through continued growth in generosity as more gifts are being received. No long-term borrowing is anticipated.

Thank you once again for your continued support. Together, we trust God will lead us to make an even greater impact as we share the Good News in our community and around the world!

Self-Employed


