And finally, I want to remind you for some leader encouragement, I want to remind you of the mission of Valley Church. If you can do those three things, greet students by name, have one meaningful interaction, and share at least one thing with students about following Jesus, you will help in our mission of mobilizing students' God-given potential to deeply love Christ and their neighbors.
