BOTTOM LINE

Your character matters.

SCRIPTURE

Proverbs 4:25-27 NLT

GOAL OF SMALL GROUP

To help students understand what good character is and why it's valuable to their lives, and to encourage them to see how the choices they're making now can impact their character as they grow.

THINK ABOUT THIS

This week, we're talking about how wisdom helps us build character. Though they may be familiar with the word, be sure to define what you mean by character as you begin the conversation. Character is who we are, even when no one is watching. It's the way we choose to live and treat others. And good character comes with the help of God's wisdom in our lives! As you talk this week, focus the conversation around what good, strong character looks like instead of talking about what makes bad character. You don't want to inadvertently shame or call out a student who may not be applying wisdom to their own character just yet! So, focus on the good to encourage them in who they can become as they walk with Jesus. The best example for good character? Jesus Himself! So, point your group to the character of Jesus as a model for them to look to. It's not so much about changing their behaviors to try to become someone different. Instead, it's about letting the wisdom of the Holy Spirit into their hearts to make them more like Jesus.

This guide is a suggestion, not a formula. Adjust the questions and activities as needed, and don't feel like you need to do, or ask, everything you see here.

DO THIS (EXPERIENCE) 1

Find a video clip from a show or movie you know your students are watching. Watch it together and ask: "Where did someone show good character?" (For a low-tech option, scatter the provided scenario cards in the middle of your group and ask your students to talk about how they'd respond with character/wisdom in each situation.)

- 5. How might the choices you make impact your character?
- 6. What's one thing you can do today to build good character?
