LIFE GROUP GUIDE

SHARE

- 1. What's your favorite Super Bowl (or party) snack?
- 2. Share about a time when someone gave you a great pep talk.

STUDY

- 3. Read John 15:18-20 in your Bible and put it into your own words.
- 4. Continue reading John 15:21-25. Which takeaway from the message stood out to you the most? Why
- 5. Discuss in your group how you feel about the persecution of Christians around the world. How have you or anyone close to you been impacted by disapproval or rejection because of your faith?
- 6. Have you recently experienced opposition because of your faith? Explain. If you rarely experience opposition, remember Jesus says persecution is inevitable for his followers, what do you think is keeping you from being opposed?

DIGGING DEEPER

7. Read 1 Peter 4:12-19. How might opposition make believers more like Jesus (v. 13-14)?

- 8. John 15:21 and 1 Peter 4:14 talk about being persecuted for the name of Jesus. What's the difference between being afflicted because of the name of Jesus and being mistreated because of our own choices? How can you tell the difference?
- 9. What is your typical response when you hear about or experience persecution? What are steps we can take to trust God (v. 19) when persecution comes instead of respond in our own strength?
- 10. How might being persecuted give someone an opportunity to witness for Christ and respond with courageous compassion (v. 17-18)?
- 11. Where can you see the possibility of persecution in connection with your bold faith commitments? Explain.
