3D1 STRATEGY OF EVANGELISM

The 3D1 process is a simple, intentional way to live on mission every day — right where God has placed you. It helps you slow down, see people as individuals with real stories, and engage them with both truth and love over time. Rather than forcing conversations or relying on perfect moments, 3D1 encourages you to build genuine relationships, listen well, and trust the Holy Spirit to work through ordinary interactions. As you practice this process, evangelism becomes less about pressure and more about presence — faithfully showing up, praying intentionally, and being ready to point people to Jesus when the opportunity comes.

Used consistently, 3D1 equips you to share your faith naturally and confidently as part of your everyday life, not just special events or programs.

DEVELOP *Friendships*

A process of building authentic friendships with non-believers based on common interests by offering unconditional acceptance with relational intelligence. (Trust)

- Be intentional
- Find common ground
- Hang out together
- Build bridges of trust

DISCOVER *Stories*

A process of extending genuine interest and curiosity, seeking to sincerely understand through asking relevant questions and listening really well. (Empathy)

- See others from God's perspective
- Start with compassion
- Be vulnerable (Humility)
- Listen well (Empathy)
- Ask great questions (Curiosity)
- Look for spiritual pivot points (Intentionality)
- Build bridges to new learning (Self-Discovery)

DISCERN *Next Steps*

A process of prayerfully determining the best next steps to engage the relationship and respectfully facilitate the greatest spiritual impact. (Influence)

- Pray
- Serve
- Give resources (services, outreach events, groups)
- Share the message
- Influence

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IDENTIFYING YOUR ONELIFE

What do we mean when we talk about someone who is your OneLife?

Your OneLife is a friend you sense God wants you to connect with more intentionally. It is someone whom God has placed in your sphere of influence and seems to be opening doors for deeper spiritual conversations. A OneLife is not a "project" but a person you care deeply about with whom you want to share more of your life and faith.

Where Do I Find My OneLife?

- Where you spend time or hang out
- People with similar interests, common ground
- Natural connections
- Where God provides an opportunity with a friend or acquaintance (i.e. a friend has a serious health issue, loses a job, has marital problems, has an accident, etc.), reach out, respond to God's leading
- Key life events
- Set specific and focused goals
- Prayer
